## The Program

The Bachelor of Arts in English major/minor program prepares students to become communicators, readers, and writers with advanced critical and analytical skills. The core requirements familiarize students with the literary canon while also exposing them to demographically and geographically diverse literature. Students have the opportunity to respond to literary works with their own ideas through the course writing assignments, which are prepared for a final capstone paper near the end of their academic career. The major and minor can be tailored to students' literary and occupational interests.

The Bachelor of Science in Education in English Education major is designed to provide students with the knowledge, skills, teaching strategies, and methods essential for teaching English at the secondary level (grades 5-12 in North Dakota).

## Advantages

Students without a previously earned bachelor's degree are required to complete a minor or second major degree program. Online minor options include: Library Media and Information Science, Business Administration, Special Needs, Early Childhood, and more. Students will work with their advisor to explore minor options to complement their career goals.

### Essential Studies Courses

English majors must complete 36 hours of Essential Studies. The following Essential Studies courses are required: COMM 110, ENGL 110, ENGL 120 or ENGL 125, PSYC 111, and SOC 110. These courses are the pre-requisite courses to this major.

Students who wish to be certified as secondary teachers must complete the 36 hours of Essential Studies. The following Essential Studies courses require a minimum grade of "C": COMM 110, ENGL 110, ENGL 120 or ENGL 125, GEOG 103, MATH 103, and PSYC 111. Secondary professional education core (including EDUC 481 Secondary Methods for English, EDUC 398 Secondary Field Experience, and EDUC/ENGL 426 Reading in the Content Area); and major English classes.
