Course Description

Instruction and laboratory practice in first aid procedures including CPR, airway obstruction, rescue breathing, and the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED). American Heart Association Heart Saver First Aid and BLS for Healthcare Providers certificates are awarded to those meeting the standards of the American Heart Association.

Course Objectives

1. Recognize when an emergency will or has occurred (INTASC 1,3,6)
2. Follow a three step plan of action for any emergency (INTASC 1,3,4,8)
3. Identify when and learn how to call for emergency medical help (INTASC 1,4)
4. Identify injuries, illnesses, and medical conditions and provide care until professional medical help arrives (INTASC 1-8)
5. To develop awareness of the importance of leading a safe, healthy lifestyle (INTASC 1, 8-10)
