## The Program

The English major/minor program prepares students to become writers, readers, and communicators with advanced critical and analytical skills. The core requirements familiarize students with the literary canon while also exposing them to demographically and geographically diverse literature. Students have the opportunity to respond to literary works with their own ideas through the course writing assignments, which are preparation for a final capstone paper near the end of their academic career. The major and minor can be tailored to students' literary and occupational interests.

## Essential Studies Courses

English majors must complete 36 hours of essential studies. The following Essential Studies courses are required: COMM 110, ENGL 110, ENGL 120 or ENGL 125, PSYC 111, and SOC 110. Additional requirement: ENGL 220. These courses are pre-requisite courses to this major.
Students who wish to be certified as secondary teachers must complete the essential studies requirements for the baccalaureate, secondary professional education core (including EDUC 481 Secondary Methods for English, EDUC 398 Secondary Field Experience, and EDUC/ENGL 426 Reading the Content Area).
