- ◆ Teachers will participate and attend the workshop on 11/9 and 11/16. (6 hours)
- ◆ Teachers will explore Kayla's Blog and reflect on what they discover on the blog that is applicable to their classroom. (3 hours)
- ◆ Teachers will implement a reimagined design into their classroom and or a new technology tool or app, and collect documentation (pictures, summary, etc.) (4 hours)
- ◆ Teachers will submit a final reflection of the Reimagined Classroom/Technology in the 21st Century implementation into their classrooms. (2 hours)

This workshop will include strategies for reimagining the Elementary Classroom involving flexible seating, classroom design, and other classroom space ideas. The second session will include tools and apps that will change the way technology is used in your classroom!


Try Something New in Your Classroom!





Hatton Eielson Public School


