

Nursing MSN Online: Nursing Leadership & Management Track (Total 37 SH Credits)

Continue Your Education

- This graduate nursing program prepares the baccalaureate prepared registered nurse for advanced nursing practice in healthcare leadership and management.
- The two path system (full-time and part-time enrollment) and courses offered online creates flexibility for adult learners.
- Students will be able to take two to four courses per semester each in a five-week block, with the exception of ten-week practicum and capstone courses.

Is This Program For You?

The mission of the Graduate Nursing Program at Mayville State University is to prepare nurses within a collaborative learning environment to effectively serve as nurse leaders in academic and practice settings who are committed to life-long learning, contribute to the discipline of nursing through rigorous intellectual inquiry and translation of evidence into practice, collaborate with interprofessional teams, and lead change, promote health, and elevate care for diverse and global populations.

MSN Program goals: The Graduate Nursing Program will prepare graduates equipped with enhanced nursing knowledge and skills as flexible leaders employed in critical action within complex and changing health, educational, and organizational systems to:

- 1. Lead change to improve quality outcomes.
- 2. Advance a culture of evidence through lifelong learning.
- 3. Build and lead collaborative interprofessional teams.
- 4. Address evolving healthcare needs.
- 5. Navigate and integrate care services across the healthcare system.
- 6. Design innovative nursing practices.
- 7. Translate evidence into practice.
- 8. Promote health and elevate care.

The Program

The MSN program is developed to provide an education that will enable the graduates to experience and achieve a fuller understanding of the discipline of nursing through mastery of the Essentials of Master's Education in Nursing from the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN).

MSN Program Nursing Leadership & Management Outcomes:

- 1. Engage in effective communication and relationship management with emphasis on influencing behaviors, diversity, shared decision-making, and interprofessional relationship development with practice and academic partners.
- **2.** Examine the influence of the health care environment on patient and population health outcomes including delivery models/work design, economics, policy, governance, outcome measures and research, performance improvement and metrics, patient safety, and risk management.
- 3. Develop effective leadership skills with focus on foundational thinking, reflective practice, systems thinking, succession planning, and change management.
- **4.** Model professionalism as an advanced practice nurse incorporating personal and professional accountability, career planning, ethical behaviors, and advocacy.
- **5.** Engage financial, human resource, information management and technology resources aligned with organizational and strategic outcome achievement in the provision of efficient, cost-effective health care.

Building upon the Master of Science in Nursing Program Core Program Student Learning Outcomes, Nursing Leadership & Management Track Student Outcomes are delineated in the Graduate Nursing Student Handbook.

Vision of the Division of Nursing

Requirements for Admission

- Graduate student admission to Mayville State University
- Completion of the Online MSN Program application
- Earned baccalaureate nursing degree (i.e. BSN or BAN) from a regionally accredited institution who holds national nursing program accreditation.
 - Current U.S. unencumbered RN licensure required throughout program enrollment in state anticipated for practicum course experiences.
- Applicant from a state other than ND or MN must be a resident of a state where MaSU is authorized to offer online degree programs, see MaSU State Authorizations Website available at: http://www.mayvillestate.edu/msu-online/msu-online/state-authorization/
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale.
- Minimum grade of 'C' required for all previous nursing courses.
- · Submit official transcripts from all previous institutions attended.
- Two letters of reference addressing nursing role performance (provided on Division of Nursing Reference form).
- Clearance for clinical practice verified within a criminal background check completed within the online program application.
- Access to a computer with high-speed Internet and virus protection.
- Maximum of 9 SH credits permitted for transfer of NURS graduate credits from a regionally accredited institution who holds national nursing program accreditation.
- MaSU BSN elective course credit (maximum of 9 credits)
 can be earned at the master's level. Specific MSN courses
 to be used to meet this requirement must be approved
 by the BSN program advisor. Currently enrolled MaSU BSN
 students may enroll in MSN courses for elective credit
 towards their BSN program without a separate admissions
 process.

Nursing MSN Online: Nursing Leadership & Management Track (Total 37 SH Credits)

Degree Requirements

- Completion of Undergraduate or Graduate Statistics course with grade 'C' or higher prior to NURS 570 course.
- Minimum of grade 'C' or higher in all courses in the major.
- NURS 550 and NURS 570 must be completed during the first year of enrollment.
- Two plans of study are available: full-time 5-semester, 18-month and part-time 8 semester, two- and one-half-year options.
 - Nursing courses are offered entirely online in 5-week blocks except for two 10-week block practicum courses and two 10-week block capstone courses.
- Students are encouraged to work with the financial aid office to ensure they are registered for the appropriate number of credits per semester for their individual financial aid and/or scholarship award.
