COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER



Mayville native Dr. John Lyng is a graduate of May-Port CG High School and Mayville State, where he was named to “Who’s Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges” in recognition of his campus involvement. A member of the Alpha Phi Sigma honor society, Lyng graduated magna cum laude from MSU. He went on to the University of North Dakota medical school, where he began to demonstrate the leadership in advancing the cause of emergency medicine that has characterized his whole career.

Dr. Lyng is Board Certified in EMS Medicine and Emergency Medicine and is a nationally registered paramedic.

He practices as an EMS physician through work as a medical specialist on the Minnesota Task Force 1 Urban Search and Rescue Team and as a medical officer on the Minnesota-1 Disaster Medical Assistance Team. In 2012, the team was deployed to the East Coast to deal with the after-effects of Hurricane Sandy, and in 2020 to California and Arizona to help fight the COVID-19 pandemic.

From 2010-2019 Lyng served as the medical director for North Memorial Health Ambulance & Air Care, and continues to work clinically as an emergency physician at North Memorial Level 1 Trauma Center in Minneapolis, Minn. and at several suburban and rural Minnesota hospitals.

Dr. Lyng has special interests in pediatric emergency medicine, trauma management, and international emergency medicine. He participates in several local, regional, and national committees that are involved in advancing the field of EMS medicine and prehospital care, including a 2019 appointment to the Minnesota State Trauma Advisory Committee.

He has been an active leader at the national and international levels through his membership in the National Association of EMS Physicians (NAEMSP), including leadership in several committees.

He is the vice chair of the NAEMSP Air Medical Transport Committee and is member-at-large of the charter NAEMSP state chapter in Minnesota. His leadership in both emergency medicine and EMS medicine has been recognized by the American College of Emergency Physicians (ACEP) and the NAEMSP with conferment of fellowship status in both organizations.

Dr. Lyng has the distinction of being one of the inaugural group of 205 EMS physicians who were conferred fellowship status in the Academic of Emergency Medical Services. He was awarded the Hennepin County Sheriff’s Office Distinguished Service Award for his role in community opioid overdose awareness programs as well as the NAEMSP President’s Award for his work as chairman of the NAEMSP Standards & Clinical Practices Committee.

Dr. Lyng lives in Minnetonka, Minn. with his wife, Megan, and children Evelyn, Elliot, and Ingrid.

Taylor Skjoldal is graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in biology and minor in psychology. A Dean's List student, she has earned magna cum laude honors and intends to pursue further education and a career as a physician's assistant.

A first generation college student on both sides of her family, Taylor has been a member of the Comets women's basketball varsity team for four years and was named an NAIA Scholar Athlete for two years. Her parents are Becky and Kevin Marier from Grafton, ND.



Jennifer Pageler is graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Education degree in elementary education. A scholarship recipient, Jennifer has earned summa cum laude honors. She is an active volunteer as a respite care provider and member of her church.

She made the decision to return to school as an older, non-traditional student and has pursued a college degree while maintaining life commitments to her family, faith, and community.

COMMENCEMENT HONORS AND RECOGNITION

Honor cords are worn by candidates for the bachelor's degree who have completed a minimum of two semesters and 30 semester hours in residence from Mayville State and achieved a scholastic average of 3.50 (cum laude, blue cord), 3.70 (magna cum laude, silver cord), and 3.90 (summa cum laude, gold cord). For publication purposes, honors are based on the cumulative grade point average at the end of the previously completed term. Once final semester grades are recorded, grade point averages are recalculated and final graduation honors are recorded to the transcript and diploma.

Candidates may wear pieces of traditional regalia such as a stole representing their cultural heritage.

The hooding ceremony for the Master of Arts in Teaching degree signifies a scholarly and personal achievement. The light blue color in the hood represents the field of education.

As a symbolic tradition to welcome individuals in to the nursing profession, nursing candidates will be presented with the baccalaureate nursing program pin and receive recognition for advancement of their nursing education.

The color of the tassel denotes the degree. At Mayville State University, the tassel colors associated with programs are: **black**, Masters of Arts in Teaching; **light blue**, Bachelor of Science in Education; **apricot**, Bachelor of Science in Nursing; **royal blue**, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Applied Science, Bachelor of University Studies, **white**, Associate of Arts.

THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

The history of academic dress reaches far back into the early days of the oldest European universities. The ordinary dress of the scholar, whether student or teacher, was the garb of a cleric. In the unheated buildings of the early universities, the long gowns would have provided warmth, while hoods would have served to cover the scholars' shaved heads.

In the United States, the American Council on Education approved a code of academic costumes that has been in effect since 1932, with changes made in 1959 and in 1986.

Gowns. In United States colleges and universities, black is the recommended color for all degrees. Variations in style represent the type of degree. The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves; the master's gown has an oblong sleeve, open at the wrists; and the gown for the doctor's degree has bell-shaped sleeves. The doctor's gown is trimmed down the front with velvet, and there are three bars of velvet across the sleeves.

Hood. The hood gives color and meaning to the costume. The hood is black with a colored lining, which is the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree. The binding or edging of the hood signifies the branch of learning to which the master's or doctorate degree pertains. Colors of some of the various subjects are: Arts, Letters, Humanities - white; Education - light blue; Fine Arts - brown; Library Science - lemon; Music - pink; Physical Education - sage green; Science - golden yellow.

Caps. Caps are black and of a material which matches the gown. A tassel is fastened to the middle point of the top of the cap. The tassel is also black or of a color appropriate to the subject. The doctor's cap may have a tassel of gold thread. The academic cap symbolizes the freedom of scholarship.

At Mayville State, candidates for degrees are asked to wear the tassels on the right front side before degrees are conferred and to shift these to the left at the moment when degrees are awarded to them.

Persons who hold degrees from foreign universities may wear the entire appropriate academic costume, including cap, gown, and hood.

North Dakota University System. Members of the State Board of Higher Education and officers of the North Dakota University System are attired in special regalia that signify their leadership role. The robe and tassel reflect the blue and gold colors found in the North Dakota state flag. A gold medallion, worn around the neck, is engraved with the North Dakota state seal.

MAYVILLE STATE UNIVERSITY MACE

A mace is a ceremonial staff used as a symbol of authority. In the Middle Ages, a mace was a heavy club weighted with a spiked or flanged metal knob at one end, and it was used chiefly by knights to crush armor. It further evolved to become a hand weapon that was used by archers and other warriors on foot. Those who guarded monarchs or other officials in processions often used a mace. By the 14th century, maces had become more ceremonial in nature and were decorated with jewels and precious metals. In modern times a mace is often carried in academic and ecclesiastical processions, especially in English-speaking countries. In the academic setting, the mace symbolizes the institution's authority to carry out its mission of seeking wisdom and truth.

A black walnut tree still growing in Mayville yielded the wood for the Mayville State University mace. Craftsman George Lilleberg, Mayville, ND, assisted by Patrick Balch and MSU Professor Emeritus of Mathematics Dr. Merwin J. Lyng, designed, turned, and finished the mace in 2004. It is decorated with the Mayville State University seal on one side, and a rendering of "Old Main" on the other. The seal features the figures "The Graduate" and "Discipline," first seen in a famous mural by artist Edwin Blashfield, as well as Mayville State's well-known motto "The School of Personal Service." Doug Anderson, a Mayville State alumnus, was the artist who created the rendition of "Old Main." The mace is 38" long. It was first carried by Dr. Gary D. Hagen at the inauguration of former MSU President Pamela M. Balch.



MAYVILLE STATE UNIVERSITY MEDALLION

The tradition of the chief officer of an educational institution to wear a medallion dates to the Middle Ages, when a seal was used to mark documents as important. Because actual possession was so significant, the seal was usually worn around the neck for safekeeping. Wearing the seal eventually became a symbol of authority.

Mayville State University's presidential medallion features two teachers and two students in front of "Old Main." The medallion is intended to be a visual representation of the intensely personal learning relationship that the university fosters among teachers and students. The bronze medallion was cast in 1999 by P. Richard Szeitz, Moorhead, MN.
