

Academic and Co-Curricular Assessment Committee

Purpose:

The Academic and Co-Curricular Assessment Committee (ACCAC) unites faculty, division chairs, staff with co-curricular assignments, and administration to advance academic and co-curricular assessment efforts for the university. The ACCAC manages designs, implements and maintain a comprehensive assessment system that promotes student learning outcomes and their continuous improvement. The committee keeps current with assessment trends and provides for the assessment education of the faculty and staff by conducting workshops and presentations and by building and maintaining a pool of useful resources helpful in promoting academic and co-curricular quality. It assists its constituents with questions and concerns about assessment assignments and works closely with them to resolve any issues. The ACCAC leads in the development, deployment and improvement of the annual reporting process and is responsible for disseminating its results to the Cabinet.

Membership:

The Academic and Co-Curricular Assessment Committee consists of the following members: The Executive Director of Institutional Effectiveness, the Coordinator of Institutional Research and Assessment, the Chair of the Essential Studies Subcommittee of the Curriculum Committee, a representative from each of the of six academic divisions, and two staff representing co-curricular programs. The Vice President for Academic Affairs and the Vice President for Student Affairs are ex-officio members.
