The Business Administration degree program provides students with a well-rounded skillset and the knowledge to be successful in a variety of business fields.


Students must complete 36 credits of essential studies for the program. Required courses in this area for the degree program include: ENGL 110, ENGL 120 or 125, COMM 110, ECON 201, ECON 202 and MATH 103.

Students complete core coursework of 49 credits and select either two specialization areas or a minor program. Elective courses may also be added, to ensure students earn no less than 120 credits upon graduation. An internship is required for this program.
