History Education majors must complete 36 hours of essential studies. The following Essential Studies courses require a minimum grade of "C": COMM 110, ENGL 110, ENGL 120 or ENGL 125, GEOG 103, MATH 103, and PSYC 111. Additional requirements to the major include ECON 105 and SOC 110. These courses are pre-requisite courses to this major. Students will also be required to complete a minor.
