Resident Students:

Mayville State has made the decision to lock the residence halls. Students who had spring semester access will find their ID cards no longer work. Students who believe they should have access after 12:01 am on March 20 should complete the application at https://prdhousing.ndus.edu/masu_thdss.

Access is granted for three reasons:

- (1) Students who were here during a substantial part of the Spring Break week. We believe the exposure risk of these students to be low.
- (2) Students who have been away from campus <u>and</u> can demonstrate a justifiable reason for being in the residence halls for the next several days.
- (3) Students who are here to pick up items and leave. For students who have been away from campus for the Spring Break week, this is our preferred mechanism. Your access will be only for a one-time entry.

The University retains discretion related to decisions about access.

Please be certain to complete your application before you arrive – access might not be granted immediately and we don't want you to be inconvenienced.

If you have emergency needs, please call **701-430-3352**. We can help you request access or assist persons who are already on campus. This is not a means to circumvent our need for you to complete the application.

For your information, if you are feeling ill, Sanford Health asks you to call before coming to their clinic if you are experiencing the most common symptoms of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19). Please call at 701-788-3800 before going to the Mayville Clinic. The symptoms of concern include fever, feeling tiredness, and having a dry cough. Additionally, Altru Medical Services has a hotline for people to call to help with determining whether they might be at risk of having contracted the Conoravirus. That number is 701-780-6358 and the questions will help you and medical professionals determine if your risk of exposure is higher or lower, and may come with recommendations for you to follow.
