COMETS START SEASON 2-0

The Comets opened up their 2020-21 season the weekend of November 13-14 in Aberdeen, SD. The Comets played Trinity Bible College on Friday and Dickinson State on Saturday,. The Dickinson State game was a non-conference game. "It was fun to have a chance to finally see the players play a game, they have been through quite a bit this fall" explains Coach Hutter.

The Mayville State University Women's Basketball team opened the 2020-21 season with a victory over Trinity Bible College by a final score of 75-36. MSU shot 50.8 percent from the field and 40.0 percent from behind the arc. They also finished with 19 points off turnovers, 15 second chance points, and 29 bench points.

<u>Jordan Zrust</u> led the Comets in the scoring department with 15 points, she also tallied four rebounds, and one assist. <u>CJ Decker</u> tallied 12 points, six rebounds, and four assists in the victory. The NDSU transfer, <u>Danneka</u> <u>Voegeli</u> recorded 11 points, four rebounds, and one assist.

<u>Grace Cote</u> tallied 12 points off the bench for the Comets, with three rebounds and 4-of-8 shooting from the outside. <u>Taylor Dean</u> and <u>Kayla</u> Rocholl each recorded five points in the victory.

The Mayville State University Women's Basketball team picked up a 70-64 victory over Dickinson State Saturday afternoon. With the win, the Comets move to 2-0 on the regular season. The Comets shot 45.1 percent from the field, 36.4 percent from the 3-point line and 16-28 from the free-throw line. MSU also had 14 points off turnovers, 15 bench points, six second chance points, and two fast break points.

<u>Jordan Zrust</u> finished with a game-high 26 points, four rebounds, one assist, and three steals. <u>CJ Decker</u> tallied 18 points, six rebounds, and two assists. <u>Danneka Voegeli</u> recorded 11 points, seven rebounds, one assist, and one steal. <u>Grace Cote</u> hit three 3-pointers in the victory with three rebounds, and one assist.

The Comets are back in action next weekend as they head to Madison, South Dakota for the Dakota Clash. MSU will play Presentation College on Friday and Dakota State on Saturday. Both games are non-conference games for the Comets.



2021 Signees

The Mayville State University Women's Basketball team announcing two signees for the 2021 recruiting class. The two signees are Cassie Sieben from Grafton, ND and Haley Reading of Hawley, MN.

Cassie Sieben is a 5'9" small forward/shooting guard from Grafton, ND where she has been a key contributor for the Spoilers over the past few seasons. Cassie is currently a member of the Honor Society, an Honor Roll student, and a two-year captain for the Spoiler Basketball Team. Her basketball accolades consist of being the best three-point shooter on the team in 2019-20 season, Class B state runner-up in 2020, and most improved player in 2018-19 season. She also runs cross country for the Spoilers and was named most improved in 2019.

Haley Reading is a 5'2" shooting guard from Hawley, MN where she is a multi-sport athlete. During the 2019-20 season her team finished the year 22-6 losing in the semi-finals game of the AA Section 8 Tournament to Pelican Rapids. Haley also ran cross country for the Nuggets and qualified for the state tournament in 2019 season. She was also named Athlete of the Month at Sanford Power in Fargo.
