The Psychology Minor complements many majors such as Business, English, and University Studies. The Psychology Education Minor complements programs in Secondary Education.

Practical Experience

The required Internship provides Applied Psychology majors with valuable experiential learning and marketable experience. Credits range from .5 to 10. Many opportunities exist to match individual interests with an appropriate field placement. Former students have interned at state hospitals, police and sheriff departments, community corrections, social service agencies, and public school counseling offices.
